### CRIME STOPPERS TASMANIA

Crime Stoppers Tasmania is an independent, not-for-profit, community organisation providing safe and anonymous ways to report crime. We are committed to creating a safer Tasmania for our children, our families and each other.

Since our inception, Crime Stoppers Tasmania has received over 50,000 anonymous reports resulting in:

- 17.000 recorded offences
- 4,000 arrests
- \$7.3 million in drugs seized
- \$5.1 million in recovered property

### CRIME STOPPERS AUSTRALIA

In 2018, Crime Stoppers Australia commissioned a report on the *Economic and Social Impact of Crime Stoppers in Australia*.

The Impact Report found Crime Stoppers offers the following benefits:

- Contributes to people feeling safer
- Builds civic responsibility by enabling people to be active and informed citizens
- Empowers people to participate through the provision of anonymity and independence from the Police
- Raises awareness of crime and crime prevention, thereby creating safer communities
- Provides a valuable service for people who are reluctant to interact with Police
- Creates a valuable source of information and enables a more efficient use of Police resources.


### THE IMPORTANCE OF ANONYMITY

People may hear, see or record something about a crime but don't know what to do, or are scared to come forward. Crime Stoppers offers people a safe way to report crime.

Reporting is anonymous, it's what you know that is important - not who you are.

It is proven that information to Crime Stoppers does assist Police to solve crime.

Crime Stoppers also offers rewards of up to \$2,000 if the information provided leads to the charging or arrest of offenders, the recovery of stolen property or the seizure of drugs. Since Crime Stoppers has been operating in Tasmania, we've awarded more than \$20,000 in rewards.

### **OUR IMPACT**

Crime Stoppers is Australia's most recognised and trusted information reporting service. The brand is associated with 'positive social behaviour' and it provides an avenue for people to take responsibility.

Crime Stoppers programs across Australia work collaboratively to create a powerful response to cross-border crimes, such as illicit drug manufacture, importation and distribution, wanted fugitives, illegal firearms and missing persons.

The Crime Stoppers Australia 2018 Impact Report confirmed that Crime Stoppers is 'people power in motion'. Crime Stoppers encourages people to raise issues, which creates awareness; encouraging people to speak up and engage, knowing that their contribution is valued and welcomed.



In 1976, Greg MacAleese, a detective in Albuquerque, New Mexico, USA, had exhausted all possible leads in a particularly brutal murder case and took an unorthodox approach. He arranged for a re-enactment of the murder to be shown on a local TV station and invited viewers to call him with information. In return he offered them anonymity and the possibility of a cash reward if the information led to an arrest. An arrest was made within five days of the re-enactment being shown, and Crime Stoppers began.

Today more than 1700 Crime Stoppers services operate worldwide, including one in every Australian state and territory.

Crime Stoppers assists in solving crime somewhere in the world every 14 minutes.

### CRIME STOPPERS TASMANIA

In 1986, prior to the establishment of Crime Stoppers in Tasmania, the Lions Clubs of Tasmania District Chairman Mr David (Dickie) Daniels spearheaded the Drug Education Network, which still exists some 30 years later.

Subsequently, David and a team of supporters, in close consultation with Tasmania Police Officer Darren Hine, embarked on the journey to establish the Crime Stoppers program in Tasmania. In 1993 at a meeting held at the Police Academy in Rokeby, the Crime Stoppers Board was established by Police, business and community volunteers.

David has worked tirelessly ever since and was awarded an Order of Australia Medal in 2006 for Crime Abatement and Drug Awareness.

Crime Stoppers Tasmania has delivered many successful anti-drug campaigns. These have prompted the community to provide valuable information to Tasmania Police; resulting in the seizure of vast amounts of drugs worth

many millions of dollars, and preventing them from coming into the state.

Tasmania Police has a clear message to criminals involved in the manufacture and distribution of drugs: "We will identify you, we will investigate you and we will prosecute you for the importation of illicit drugs into Tasmania."

Over the years, annual Crime Stoppers Week Drug Campaigns have prompted many local drug busts across the State, resulting in numerous charges and arrests.

Crime Stoppers Tasmania called for community action in the 2018/2019 campaign 'Dob in a Dealer' which saw crime reports triple. Tasmania punched well above its weight amongst the other states in achieving this result.

Tasmanians have said a resounding NO to drugs in our island state.

### CALLS TO CRIME STOPPERS HELP SOLVE CRIME



1994 – Power substations were damaged to cut the power to a number of businesses to disarm alarms. A Crime Stoppers report was received indicating who had damaged the substation which in turn led to the identification of the offenders who wanted to carry out the burglaries.



1999 – An infamous inmate from Risdon Prison escaped. A call to Crime Stoppers provided information on which way he was heading. The inmate was apprehended soon after.



2011 – Significant damage was caused to vehicles and houses in a northern Tasmanian suburb. An anonymous report to Crime Stoppers indicated who the offenders were and what had occurred. Six individuals were interviewed and charged with a total of 35 offences.



2012 – A school was burgled and several laptops stolen. Crime Stoppers received a report with details of offenders and the location of the laptops. Offenders were charged and 14 laptops were recovered.



2014 – Crime Stoppers was notified that a prolific offender had a large amount of stolen goods hidden in a hired storage container. When searched, Police located approximately \$20,000 worth of stolen property inside the container.



2014 – An anonymous report was received regarding suspicious activity at a remote location, with numerous people coming and going from the residence. A Police search located \$36,750 in cash and 19 packets of dried cannabis.



2016 – The Crime Stoppers Operation Roam campaign put one of Australia's most wanted fugitives behind bars. Samuel Terrance McGovern was located at a Tasmanian shopping centre. McGovern was arrested and extradited to NSW.



2008 - 2019 – Over 100 information reports received about missing person Helen Munnings. Investigations continue.



2019 – The murder of Jarrod Turner resulted in almost 50 information reports. Police made multiple arrests relating to this crime.



2018 – A follow up of a Crime Stoppers report led to a rural property being searched. As a result, 104 cannabis plants and eight firearms were seized, with one offender arrested and charged.



2019 – A Crime Stoppers report provided information in relation to a false report to Police where a particularly nasty crime had been committed. As a result, Police changed the direction of their investigation and were able to charge the offenders



2019 – Stolen goods were recovered in bushland as a result of a report to Crime Stoppers. The goods were valued at over \$100,000, and had been missing for a number of months, with no significant leads as to their whereabouts.


