Information provided anonymously to Crime Stoppers can help police recover stolen goods and catch thieves.

In the early hours of 15th January and 20th February 2019 persons have entered *Total Ag Solutions*, 37 Stony Rise Road, Devonport.

On both occasions offenders have accessed a storage yard on the premises and stolen a Kubota rough terrain vehicle (RTV) pictured. Driving them away from the location at a total cost of over \$38 000.00.

Mr Zac Hardman, Stock Controller, Total Ag Solutions says the effects of these thefts are far greater than the lost stock. The impact on the business extends to fence repairs, increasing security, staff time, insurance claim excesses and higher insurance premiums.

"We have had to reorganise our yard to block access to the security fence with scrap steel, bins and crated goods and purchased high grade padlocks for internal gates," said Mr Hardman.

"There are also concerns for the security of staff who may be working after hours," he added.

Constable Phillip Money from the Devonport Criminal Investigation Branch advises that the stolen vehicles have not yet been recovered and public assistance can make all the difference to investigations.

Crime Stoppers Tasmania Chair, David Daniels OAM has urged the community to be wary when buying items second-hand, and if they have any information that will assist the Police to recover stolen goods and catch thieves to call Crime Stoppers now.
